Fireworks Safety Information

Independence Day is just around the corner with warm weather, barbecues, family get-togethers, and fireworks. We would like everyone to have a safe, enjoyable 4th of July, so we are spreading the word that use of illegal fireworks could result in a citation. Eagle Point Municipal Code Chapter 8.24 outlines the regulations regarding fireworks and explosive devices. The code establishes a "zero tolerance" approach for use of illegal fireworks due to the extreme danger they pose. If anyone lights off illegal fireworks at your residence, you could be subject to a fine up to \$500 as the "Person in Charge" of the residence. Illegal fireworks include: firecrackers, bottle rockets, roman candles, aerial shell and mortars, missiles, rockets, silver salutes, cherry bombs, and M-80's. Together We Make Our Community Safer!

The City's ordinance for weeds and excessive vegetation requires all property owners within the City limits with property less than one acre to maintain their grass and vegetation on their property to a height less than 10 inches. Shrubs, trees, flowers, vegetable gardens are excluded from the requirements. If your property is greater than one acre in the City limits, a 15-foot fire break (30 feet from any structure, including a fence) is required. Along with mitigating the safety hazard that tall, dry weeds pose to the community, our weed abatement program helps maintain the atmosphere of our community that many appreciate about Eagle Point.

The end of school and beginning of summer means that camping and boating season is underway for many Eagle Point residents. As boats and RV's are prepared for summer adventures we ask residents to be mindful of the length of time these items are parked on public streets. Eagle Point Municipal Code Section 10.12.040 provides guidelines for parking on public streets. The guidelines are as follows:

No person shall park any mobile home, motor home, van, car, camper, camp trailer, boat or other recreational vehicle, truck or utility trailer:

- In one location on any portion of any public street or alley for any period longer than 72 consecutive hours, except that short-term out of town visitors may park such recreational vehicles for a period not to exceed two weeks in any one calendar year; or
- In one location on any portion of any public street, alley or in the front setback area of any residential property, when parking in such setback area impairs clear vision for traffic safety.

We appreciate your cooperation as we all work together to make our town a great place to live!



Eagle Point Department of Public Works

As summer approaches Public Works continues to clear the street right of way and drainage ditches of high weeds. As a reminder, the sidewalks are to be kept clear of shrubs and overhanging trees (to a height of 7 feet) by each property owner. Many streets were also designed with planter areas between the curb and sidewalk. Maintenance of the planter areas is also the responsibility of the adjacent property owner. While also providing a buffer from the street, these provide opportunities for landscape and beautification

Construction is nearly complete on the Crystal Drive/Teakwood Drive Storm Improvements. Once paving is completed, the intersection will be re-signed as a four-way stop intersection.

Construction is underway on the Lucas Park Restroom project, and the Eagle Point Splash Park. The splash park equipment was selected through the Parks and Recreation Commission. The splash park will be located between Napa Street and Main Street, next to Nova Park. A grant from the Ford Family Foundation funded the Lucas Park Restrooms, allowing the splash park project to begin construction earlier than originally scheduled.

Vacancies on the Eagle Point Economic Development Commission

Candidacy Filing for Offices of Mayor and Three City Councilors

As of June 1, 2016, the City of Eagle Point will accept filings for candidacy of the elected offices of Mayor for a term of two years, and three City Councilors for terms of four years. The term of office of elected officers shall commence on the first Council Meeting in January, 2017. Persons interested must be, at the time of election, a qualified elector as defined in Section 2, Article II of the Oregon Constitution and shall have been a resident within the city limits of the City of Eagle Point for the twelve-month period immediately preceding the November 2016 election. Election packets may be obtained from the City of Eagle Point at City Hall, 17 South Buchanan Avenue. It is suggested that completed election filing forms be returned to Cindy Hughes, City Recorder, on August 24, 2016 to meet the August 30, 2016 filing deadline with the Jackson County Elections Office.
