You Are Invited....YMCA Community Meeting on November 5th



The City of Eagle Point has partnered with the Rogue Valley Family YMCA and Jackson County School District #9 to provide youth sports and a summer day camp program in Eagle Point for the surrounding community. In the last few years, the School District has built upon the partnership to offer an afterschool program. As the success of each program grows, the Rogue Valley Family YMCA has listened as the community has asked, "What next?"

In early 2016 the Rogue Valley Family YMCA reached out to their affiliate Y-USA to conduct an online survey to study the compelling needs of the community to plan for future programs. The survey was distributed, and the top community needs were expressed for both adult and youth/teens surveyed. The survey results are available on the city website. Now the YMCA wants to hear directly from you at a community meeting scheduled for Saturday, November 5, 2016 at 11:00 a.m. in the Ashpole Community Center (Eagle Point City Hall). All are invited to participate in this important planning exercise for the future of Eagle Point. - Increasing and adding partnerships with business, churches, and community organizations in Eagle Point to serve more residents
- Building a Community Center to house more programs and serve more residents

CITY OF EAGLE POINT ANNUAL LEAF PICKUP

THE CITY OF EAGLE POINT WILL CONDUCT ITS ANNUAL LEAF PICKUP NOVEMBER 14 - DECEMBER 16, 2016. PICKUPS WILL NOT OCCUR BEFORE OR AFTER THESE DATES.

- **BAGGED LEAVES ONLY** – CREWS ARE NOT ABLE TO PICK UP BAGS CONTAINING OTHER DEBRIS. PLEASE DO NOT INCLUDE: LIMBS, BRUSH, PRUNINGS, LAWN CLIPPINGS, GARBAGE.
- **BAGGED LEAVES MUST WEIGH LESS THAN 40 LBS**
- **PLEASE DO NOT PLACE BAGS IN THE STREET** – ALL BAGS SHOULD BE PLACED BEHIND THE CURB CLOSE TO THE STREET FOR PICKUP. BAGS CANNOT BE COLLECTED ON PRIVATE PROPERTY.
- **PLEASE DO NOT BLOW LEAVES INTO THE STREETS**

THE CITY CANNOT SPECIFY THE EXACT PICK-UP DATE ON A PARTICULAR STREET. PROGRESS MAY BE AFFECTED BY WEATHER, LEAF VOLUMES AND OTHER DEMANDS PLACED UPON THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT. PLEASE DO NOT CALL THE CITY FOR PICKUPS. ANY PERSON WISHING TO OBTAIN BAGGED LEAVES FOR MULCH MAY REQUEST THEM BY PHONING THE PUBLIC WORKS SHOP AT 826-4212 EXT 138. PLACEMENT OF LEAVES IN THE PUBLIC RIGHT OF WAY INCLUDING CURB OR SIDEWALK AREA DURING TIMES OTHER THAN THOSE SPECIFIED AS PICKUP DATES IS A VIOLATION OF CITY ORDINANCE.

2-1-1 info

2-1-1 is the Federal Communication Commission's three-digit dialing code for information and referral. 2-1-1 info serves every Oregon county. Bilingual staff can take calls in 10 languages, and all staff have access to a translation service that can assist with more than 140 languages. Through 2-1-1 citizens can get free guidance and information about energy and food assistance; housing and shelters; healthcare and insurance; parenting/early childhood resources and prenatal care; services for veterans; addiction prevention and rehabilitation programs; reentry help for ex-offenders; support groups for individuals with mental illnesses or special needs; a safe, confidential path out of physical and/or emotional domestic abuse; and many more community resources. 2-1-1 info can be accessed by a toll-free call to 2-1-1 or by visiting the website www.211.org. The service will put you in touch with local organizations that provide critical service that can improve - and save - lives.

2016 Prescription Drug Take-Back Day was a Success!

Eagle Point Police hosted a 2016 Drug Take-Back event on October 22nd. During the four hour event Officer Cardenas assisted 11 citizens turn in a total of 17 pounds of unused/expired medication. If you missed this event, keep in mind that a permanent medication turn-in drop box is located in the lobby of the Eagle Point Police Department. The drop box is open during business hours. Needles, sharps, asthma inhalers, and illicit drugs are not accepted.

2016 Pavement Management Program

The 2016 Pavement Management Program has been completed. Since initiation of the program in 2012, the City has made significant progress on pavement maintenance for the City's streets. Of the City's total 34 original centerline miles of pavement, over 70 percent has been completed. Planning and preparation for next summer's Pavement Maintenance Program will begin in early 2017.

Lucas Park Grand Opening

The Eagle Point Parks Foundation hosted the grand opening of Lucas Park on Saturday, October 1st, celebrating the official opening of the park and completion of the two newest improvements: Lucas Park restrooms and playground. The weather cooperated for the event which featured live music, food vendors, and games enjoyed by nearly 200 attendees. Special thanks to the Foundation for organizing the event, and to the volunteers who donated time and resources. Eagle Point Public Works personnel did a commendable job finishing the park and playground before the event. In the near future the Outdoor Educational Classroom and a hillside slide will be installed to complete the current design.
