#### Vacancies on the Eagle Point Budget Committee, Economic Development Commission, Parks & Recreation Commission, and Planning Commission.

The City of Eagle Point is accepting applications from persons interested in serving on the Budget Committee, Economic Development Commission, Parks and Recreation Commission, or Planning Commission.

Budget Committee or Planning Commission applicants must currently reside within the City limits of Eagle Point, have resided in the City for at least one full year and must be eligible to register to vote. The vacancy on the Economic Development Commission may be filled by a resident or a non-resident of the City of Eagle Point having a vested interest in Eagle Point. Residents must currently reside within the City limits, have resided in the City for at least one full year and must be eligible to register to vote. Applicants for the Parks and Recreation Commission will have a minimum residency period of one year in the City of Eagle Point or its Urban Growth Boundary, and be eligible to register to vote.

### Potholes and Road Hazards



Rain and cold temperatures often increase the number of potholes that appear each winter. The wet weather and the freeze/thaw cycles expand and contract the pavement, accelerating the deterioration process sometimes in just one season. Potholes can be patched during the winter, mainly as temporary fixes until the weather improves for a more durable patch, or a larger paving project.

The City has been budgeting and scheduling projects to improve the pavement on several streets, with many more streets to be improved in the years to come. The 2nd annual Eagle Point Economic Forum was held on Saturday, January 10, 2015 at Eagle Point's Ashpole Community Center.
