PUBLIC NOTICE: Vacancy on the Eagle Point Community Development Commission



The City of Eagle Point is accepting applications from persons interested in serving on the Community Development Commission. Several positions are available; however, applications should be submitted as soon as possible. Prior to appointment, applicants must have lived in the city limits for a period of at least one full year, or be a non-resident with a vested interest in City of Eagle Point. Fences, Walls & Screen Planting

The City has standards for fence and wall construction, as well as plantings established for screening purposes, to ensure public safety, promote neighborhood compatibility and avoid sight line obstructions for vehicles and pedestrians. One of the ways we try to ensure compliance is by requiring a permit prior to their installation. An application is submitted at City Hall with a plan view drawing showing the existing structures and the proposed fence, wall and/or screen planting along with a side view showing height, material and color. The proposal is then reviewed by City staff with these developmental standards in mind:

1. Within the 15 foot front yard setback, the height is limited to 3 1/2 feet measured from the top of the curb along the adjacent street.
2. Within the 10 foot setback along a street on a corner lot, the height is limited to 3 1/2 feet, also measured from the top of the curb.
3. Within the rear and side yards, the height is limited to 8 feet from the ground.
4. Electrified fences are not allowed, except as allowed in the Residential Farm zoning district, and all non-residential zoning districts. However, this does not prohibit "radio" fencing programmed to the collar of an animal.
5. The installation shall not extend beyond the property line.
6. In addition to a Fence & Screen Planting Permit, the State of Oregon requires a Building Permit with engineered plans for any fence exceeding 7 feet in height.

From time to time, it comes to the City's attention that a fence, wall or screen planting is too tall or in a place it's not supposed to be. It's common in those situations that the property owner may not have applied for a permit and possibly unaware one was required. While fences, walls and screen planting not in compliance with City standards will likely be required to be removed, we will make every effort to help the owner reach compliance as painlessly as possible.

Safety Around Buses

Now that we have bus service around town, it's important to think about being safe around them, as well as all other vehicles in our growing community. As we should do when near any vehicle (moving or not) using our roads or auto-oriented places such as parking lots and driveways, it's critical to be extra aware of our surroundings. Here are a few things to think about:

- Always stay in sight of the driver.
- Don't cross behind the vehicle. If you can't see the driver, they probably can't see you.
- Stay at least 10 feet away from any vehicle (including buses) in order to stay out of the driver's Danger Zone. It's often not possible for the driver to see someone, especially a small child, around the wheels of their vehicle.
- Don't hurry when near a bus or vehicle. If rushing, you're more likely to ignore traffic around you.
- Don't dash out into the street from around a bus or large vehicle. Always cross at a street corner, use the crosswalk when available, and look both ways before crossing.
